

The fortress of Châteauneuf is one of the last remaining vestiges of 16th-century medieval architecture, rarely seen in such a good state of repair. In the 15th century, Châteauneuf Castle featured some magnificent decorative architecture. These features can still be seen, enhanced by a succession of improvements carried out over the centuries.

Since 2008 the castle has belonged to the Regional Council who are continuing restoration work to make it the key showpiece in a built heritage & culture project. Besides being a major tourist attraction, the castle is rooted in the collective memory of our region and is part of its very identity.



In the chapel, some outstanding murals can be seen, the work of a great painter who belonged to the Burgundy Dukes' entourage.

The Logis des Hôtes (guest quarters) which were built

by Philippe Pot during the 15th century, have been

renovated and now house *an interpretative centre*. Stimulate your senses on an exploration of the castle's

history through a unique, beautifully arranged tour.

The furnished apartments of the Grand Logis (main living quarters) offer a glimpse of the way of life in a medieval castle under the Ancien Régime.



They feature *a beautiful collection of 17th-century tapestries* depicting the life of Moses.



Don't forget to visit *the gardens of medieval inspiration*, *the castle attic*, etc.
